A. SCIENTIFIC PRESENTATION/ORAL PRESENTATION

Hypothesis-driven research intended to be presented as a 6-minute oral podium presentation.

1. All scientific presenters should submit a written abstract (Word document or pdf) by May 31, 2022
 - If accepted for oral presentation, details regarding presentation during the Annual Meeting will be provided.
 - If accepted for Electronic Exhibit presentation, please follow the presentation guidelines in Part B below.
2. Presenters of accepted abstracts must register for the ASHNR Annual Meeting.
3. Please choose one submission category:
 - Pediatric/Congenital
 - Sinus
 - Orbit
 - Face
 - Cranial Nerves
 - Temporal Bone
 - Skull Base
 - Neck
 - General/Other
4. Multiple abstracts on different topics may be submitted.
5. Maximum length: 2,500 characters, not including title, authors, images, figures.
6. Changes can be made to submitted abstracts until the deadline.
7. Only oral scientific presentations can be considered for the Radiologist-In-Training award, with a \$1000 stipend provided upon submission of the winning scientific paper to the American Journal of Neuroradiology (AJNR).

*** ABSTRACT GUIDELINES ***

- At least one reference is required, and up to five references may be included.
- Required presentation format: Purpose, Materials and Methods, Results, Conclusion.
- The use of charts, tables and graphics is encouraged if relevant to the research submitted.
- Only one graphic file with a maximum of four images is permitted.
- Required graphic file resolution is 300 dpi or greater (e.g. 900 pixel width by 900 pixel height for a 3-inch by 3-inch image).
- Maximum file size of 100 megabytes.
- Only .jpg and .gif formats are accepted.

B. ELECTRONIC EDUCATIONAL EXHIBIT

Educational Exhibits should be visually-oriented educational presentations designed to teach and/or review topics related to head and neck imaging. They should be presented as multi-slide PowerPoint Presentations. Deadline is May 31, 2022

- Case Reports or Case Series may be submitted as Electronic Exhibits
- Widescreen format (16:9) is preferred.
- Required abstract format: summary of the planned presentation and list of educational objectives.
- “Purpose, Materials/Methods, Results and Conclusion” format is permitted if appropriate.
- Maximum Number of slides: 50
- First slide should include
 - o Title of Exhibit
 - o Author Full Names, degrees, affiliations
- Second slide should include Objectives/Purpose
- Third slide should identify any conflict of interest or financial disclosures
- Final slide should contain conclusion
- No animations (either within or between slides) are permitted

Abstract review process

All abstracts will be peer reviewed by members of the ASHNR Education Committee.

The ASHNR recognizes top presentations with a variety of awards. These include Best Educational Exhibits Awards, Certificate of Merit Awards, an In-Training Award for oral presentation, and one or more Fan Favorite Awards for case exhibits.
