This program is a synthesis of updates and practical perspectives on breast surgical pathology and selected cytopathology topics. Learners will receive state of the science information on DCIS of the breast, mammary mesenchymal lesions, breast papillary diseases, and axillary lymph nodes. Cytology topics to be covered include mediastinal cytology, EUS FNA, cytomorphology of cystic and solid pancreatic tumors, exfoliative anal cytology and interpretation of cerebrospinal fluid cytology.

- Interpret exfoliative anal cytology and understand the meaning of interpretations in clinical context.
- Recognize cytomorphologic pitfalls encountered in interpreting CSF light microscopy.
